Some Indicators of Need in Alburgh

15.4% of children under the age of 5 live in poverty. (1999**)

13.9 % of adults 65 or older live in poverty. (1999**)

52% of students at **Alburgh Community Ed. Center** received free or reduced lunches (2004-2005***)

42% of renters and **28.6%** of home owners spend 30% or more of their income on housing. (2000**)

12% of students in Vermont did not complete High School within 4 years (2005**)

23% of 8th graders and **48%** of 12th graders in Grand Isle County reported using alcohol in the last 30 days.(2005**)

20.1 % of adults in Grand Isle County report they are "binge" drinkers. (2000-2004**)
